Immunizations to Protect Vulnerable Infants

## Dear [Name of Medical Director]:

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) strongly encourages you to protect newborns at your facility who are eligible for Medi-Cal against severe RSV infection with no-cost <u>nirsevimab</u> by <u>enrolling in the California Vaccines for Children Program</u> (VFC). As your hospital is one of the birthing facilities serving most VFC-eligible infants, CDPH invites your pharmacy team to register for a special webinar for birthing hospitals on either <u>Monday</u>, <u>June 17<sup>th</sup> at 1 pm</u> (PT) or on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 18<sup>th</sup> at 12 pm</u> (PT) to learn how CDPH is supporting your enrollment in VFC, with many benefits to your facility:

**Save costs**: Enrollment in VFC will provide you with nirsevimab **at no cost for eligible infants** (current market price of \$519.75 per dose). Data from Medi-Cal indicate [number] infants eligible for Medi-Cal were born at your hospital in 2022. VFC enrollment would have saved you [\$ total amount saved] in purchase costs for these infants. Note that unimmunized infants admitted for RSV infection have an average cost of over \$11,000.

**Protect infants**: Data collected last fall and winter suggest that nirsevimab was <u>90%</u> <u>effective</u> in preventing infant hospitalization for RSV in the first months after administration.

**Minimal formulary:** After enrollment, your hospital may choose to order only RSV and Hepatitis B immunizations for newborns under your care or all pediatric vaccines.

**Prompt protection:** Immunizing infants in the hospital rather than the clinic can save time and visits while avoiding delays, hastening protection, and offering parents peace of mind.



**Public recognition:** On its <u>website</u>, CDPH has now posted, "The *Immunization-Friendly Birth Hospital Honor Roll.*" By <u>enrolling in VFC</u>, you can join your peers in the Honor Roll.

## How to Enroll to Protect Infants Before Next RSV Season

We're calling on you and other birth and neonatal hospitals that serve Medi-Cal and uninsured patients to prepare for the upcoming RSV season by August 31, 2024.
